

For the past decade, researchers at the Centre of Excellence for Women's Health have been producing resources about trauma informed practice, in collaboration with governments and organizations across Canada. We have used the term trauma informed practice, to differentiate this approach from trauma specific care. All materials endorse the trauma and violence informed view that understanding and action is needed at individual, organizational and systemic levels.

Resources with only a description in English are not currently available in French.




<p>3</p> 	<p>Trauma Informed Practice Guide</p> <p>This guide on trauma informed practice remains popular 10 years after its co-development with the addictions field in BC. It includes appendices on self care for practitioners, an organizational checklist, approaches to responding to disclosure, and grounding skills.</p>

4		<p><u>Healing Families, Helping Systems: A Trauma-Informed Practice Guide for Working with Children, Youth and Families</u></p> <p>This guide is the result of a project of the Ministry of Children and Family Development in BC with the goals of identifying trauma-informed approaches, to raise awareness, and to increase capacity among service providers delivering child and youth services. It describes how TIP can be realized in interactions with children and youth, with families, through worker wellness, through action at the organizational level and at the leadership level.</p>
5		<p></p> <p><u>Trauma Informed Development and Education (TIDE) at the YWCA Toronto</u></p> <p>The YWCA Toronto worked with CEWH to generate an organizational shift toward trauma informed practice across the YWCA Toronto locations. This project was designed to increase the skills and practices of staff, leadership, and program partners. One element was the involvement of program participants in the development of a workbook to strengthen their contributions to trauma-informed action within their organization or community. It is for women with lived experience who wish to increase their leadership capacity, build their networks, strengthen skills and build confidence to lead trauma informed change.</p>
6		<p><u>Trauma Informed Practice and the Opioid Crisis: A Discussion Guide for Health Care and Social Service Providers</u></p> <p>This resource is an example of how trauma informed practice can be applied to an issue to support policy and practice change. <p>8</p>		<p><u>Methamphetamine and trauma informed approaches</u></p> <p>This conversation starter for substance use service providers describes the principles of trauma informed practice and offers examples of strategies for incorporating them into methamphetamine treatment responses. <p>11</p>		<p><u>Wraparound Programs and Trauma-informed Practice</u></p> <p>This info sheet describes how programs serving pregnant and parenting women enact and measure the achievement of trauma informed practice, in multidimensional wraparound services.</p>

12		<p>Repairing the Holes in the Net</p> <p>Repairing the Holes in the Net was a research and system change initiative to improve policy and practice related to care and support for northern women experiencing homelessness, mental health and substance use concerns. Women in the 3 northern territories who were precariously housed, experiencing violence and mental health concerns offered a brilliant view of their situation – of unresolved trauma, poverty and social exclusion, inability to find and maintain housing and ineffective services – and how small and large policy and practice change that is trauma informed could help.</p>

14		<p>Trauma Informed Practice Foundations Course for Justice, Public Safety and Anti-violence Community sectors in BC</p> <p>This TIP Foundations Curriculum is available to those currently employed in corrections, Crown, lawyers, police, and victim services/anti-violence programs. It is designed to provide an introduction to trauma informed practice, and how to integrate knowledge about how people are affected by trauma into procedures, practices and services.</p>
15		<p>A Digital Handbook on Wraparound programs</p> <p>The handbook supports the development, operation, and sustainability of wraparound programs for pregnant and/or early parenting women and gender diverse people with substance use and other concerns. It includes two sections on trauma informed approaches: 1) Trauma informed practice for clients 2) Well being for staff and organizational wellbeing.</p>
