Foundations that provide funding for GBV work and research as reported in the GBV database in 2022

Context

This list has been curated from the Gender-based violence database which is available on the Knowledge Hub website [Gender-Based Violence \(GBV\) Database - GBV Database - Western University](#).

The database is built from information reported by Canadian charitable organizations on the T3010 form which is submitted annually to the Canada Revenue Agency. Organizations in this database indicated that they engage in activities related to gender-based violence. A search was conducted of the database for the 2022 reporting of all charitable foundations to determine which organizations provide grants or operating funds for research or programming. 101 organizations were identified. The results were reviewed to clarify whether funds could be accessed through application processes, and for applicability to this investment.

Many organizations that classified themselves as private or charitable foundations in the T3010 forms appear to exist for the sole purpose of supporting one agency – often a shelter. Other organizations classified as charitable foundations are service providers and do not award money to other agencies. The table below identifies 17 foundations to which applications can be made for funding for programming and/or research.

This list is not considered to be comprehensive. We acknowledge there may be other funding sources available. We invite you to share information about these sources.

Fondations qui financent le travail et la recherche sur la violence liée au sexe, comme indiqué dans la base de données sur la violence liée au sexe en 2022

Cette liste a été établie à partir de la base de données sur la violence fondée sur le genre, disponible sur le site web du Knowledge Hub [Base de données sur la violence fondée sur le sexe - Base de données sur la violence fondée sur le sexe - Western University](#).

La base de données est constituée à partir des informations déclarées par les organisations caritatives canadiennes sur le formulaire T3010 soumis chaque année à l'Agence du revenu du Canada. Les organisations figurant dans cette base de données ont indiqué qu'elles menaient des activités liées à la violence sexiste. Une recherche a été effectuée dans la base de données pour le rapport 2022 de toutes les fondations caritatives afin de déterminer quelles organisations fournissent des subventions ou des fonds de fonctionnement pour la recherche ou la programmation. 101 organisations ont été identifiées. Les résultats ont été examinés afin de déterminer si les fonds étaient accessibles par le biais de processus de demande et s'ils étaient applicables à cet investissement.

Nombreuses organisations qui se sont classées comme fondations privées ou caritatives dans les formulaires T3010 semblent exister dans le seul but de soutenir un organisme - souvent un refuge. D'autres organisations classées comme fondations caritatives sont des prestataires de services et n'octroient pas d'argent à d'autres agences. Le tableau ci-dessous identifie 17 fondations auprès desquelles des demandes de financement de programmes et/ou de recherches peuvent être déposées.

Cette liste n'est pas exhaustive. Nous reconnaissons que d'autres sources de financement peuvent être disponibles. Nous vous invitons à nous communiquer des informations sur ces sources.
